Grant Review

EMS County – All eligible members had the opportunity to submit required documents by 3/31/2026. Disbursements have been made per the documentation received from eligible members.

EMS RAC – Request for equipment or education for compliant members was open through 3/31/2026. All request have been reviewed by the designated injury prevention education committee chairs. Notices have been sent to all requesting members providing additional information regarding their eligibility and instructions for submitting receipts and proof of payment matching their requested items or providing instructions for reimbursement if items are above \$3000. Although many request have been completed, some remain open and will be completed as received.

RAC Development – Injury Prevention/Education committee has secured “Science of Trauma Education” to be held in place of the July meeting. Emails will be sent to the membership asking for additional information regarding who will be attending the training in July. CE’s will be available for all attendees. If a cap is needed for the amount of attendees, it will be evenly distributed between members.

Compliant members are eligible for reimbursement up to \$500 for any education attended from 9/1/2025 through 7/31/2026. Invoices and proof of payment should be sent to the RAC office for reimbursement. This reimbursement will be paid as received.

Stroke education was approved as ann online self-paced course “57ACLS” Advanced Stroke Life Support at \$157.00 per person. It is designed to educate healthcare professionals to effectively manage stroke patients across various clinical settings. The RAC will receive invoices from Hendrick as members sign up for the course and those invoices will be paid directly to Hendrick. If additional information is needed, contact the RAC office.

Hospital Data Management course has been completed and funding has been provided.

Cadaver lab dates 4/21/2026 is full and has been paid, 5/19/2026 has availability but 6/23/2026 is full.

This is a first come basis.

Trauma Care After Resuscitation training is available for up to 30 members. If interested, contact the RAC office (or Stephanie Cantu) for additional information

Motion to approve the Financial and Grant Review by Jonathan Galinak; second by Marta Pagura; all in favor, none opposed.

Bylaw Review – By-law Review committee volunteers are Jonathan Galinak, Kellie Batagan and Delany Golson. Updates and changes should be submitted by 6/20/2026 in order for those to be sent to the membership for review. It is likely these will not be approved until the October meeting based on the Education that will take the place of the July GA meeting.

Committee Review

STEMI – The committee reviewed data pulled from the current PI reports. Reviewed changes to the current checklist to make it easier to understand and clarify the do's and don'ts. Cardiologist will review for accuracy. Reminder that Hendrick S does not have 24 hour STEMI coverage. (See Sign-in sheet and agenda attached for additional information.)

Stroke – The committee compared ESLS and ASLS information to send out to the RAC members. Dr Hibbs, Stroke Medical Director at Hendrick volunteered to share Stroke Education at the October GA meeting. Hendrick North recently had a water issue causing flooding to the MRI floor but was able to continue without going on divert. The committee reviewed the Stroke language in the current PI reports and will email proposed changes in order for that to be corrected before the next PI submittal. (See Sign-in sheet and agenda attached for additional information.)

Performance Improvement - The committee reviewed a pending chart from October and continues to need additional information. The committee will review the requested changes to the Stroke questions and send those to the RAC office to revise. While reviewing the current PI forms, it was noticed missing or incomplete information from Hendrick N. This was discussed with Hendrick N and Hendrick N will provide the information to the PI committee prior to GETAC so that this information can be taken to GETAC. There were no current cases needing review from this PI quarter. (See Sign-in sheet and agenda attached for additional information.)

Hospital – The committee reviewed information pertaining to the Pedireadiness survey and asked members who have not completed the survey to get that completed with in the next 50 days. Coleman Co is having a large event to celebrate their 150 years and has

incorporated Pulsara. (See Sign-in sheet and agenda attached for additional information.)

Budget/Finance –The committee reviewed reconciliation reports and found no discrepancies.

Education and Injury Prevention – The committee reviewed all previously approved items and purchases and everything has been completed. The committee reiterated (previously approved) funding allocated to specific education should be re-routed to other previously approved education and injury prevention items as necessary in order to make sure all funding is used within this contract period ending 8/31/2026.

Whole Blood – The committee reviewed obstacles facing implementations: Hendrick is struggling to get a donor pool due to being short staffed and not able to take the blood mobile out as often as necessary. The committee is hoping to receive an invitation to the Hendrick Transfusion Committee meeting on May 26 in order to continue to facilitate the smooth transition of the Whole Blood initiative. DSHS has approved the submitted budget and the committee expects to receive the first installment any day. The committee recommended establishing an account at First Bank Texas for the Whole Blood funding in order to continue to maintain coverage of funds through the FDIC. Upon receiving funding, the Whole Blood Committee will begin purchasing the start up equipment. Hendrick is working to resolve these issues. (See Sign-in sheet and agenda attached for additional information.)

Pediatric – Reminder to complete the Pedireadiness survey within the next 50 days.

- Reminder of Survey on the home page and also under Injury Prevention called Injury/Prevention Program Reporting. This should be used to report and track any IP and Education Events. Added a direct link under the Injury Prevention Tab showing what events have occurred. Since January meeting 3 more events have been held reaching over 176 people.
- Executive Members up for re-election will be emailed to the membership
- HB624 will be added to the Regional Plan, Stroke Plan, STEMI Plan and Trauma Plan as an Addendum as it was released
