GRANT REVIEW

EMS County –

Funding has been received and letters have been mailed to providers that are eligible for the EMS County grant – deadline for participation is 3/31/2024 Regional projects for EMS providers will continue to be funded from the EMS County grant

EMS RAC -

Funding has been received – this grant is used for administrative purposes. Additional funding of \$150,000 has been added to this grant and will be available for use during this contract period. The Executive Board is recommending the Injury Preveion and Education Committee make recommendations for additional use of these additional funds. The purpose of this money as it was outlined by meetings held with DSHS and RAC Executive Directors was to provide additional administrative support as the RAC Assessment continues to develop but may sserve a greater purpose providing for the needs of the membership.

RAC Development – Funding has been received – estimated \$60,000 available for injury prevention and education. Attempted to schedule an AAAM course but the provider we were working with did not follow through with the scheduling. We will continue to work to secure a date that this course can be administered in the Fall of 2024. Per the July recommendation from the General Assembly, dechokers have been ordered for infant and children – these are pending delivery and will be available upon receipt as requested. A recommendation is being made to the Injury Prevention and Education committee to approve purchases made to maintain the demand for Fall Prevention and Injury Prevention items that have been widely used throughout the region. Additional funding will be made available for compliant members to request reimbursement for injustry prevention and education expenses. Receips and Proof of Purchases should be sent to the RAC office before the deadline of 3/31/2024.

Neonatal Committee - Reviewed neonatal transports, transfer times and patient care

Education/Injury Prevention –RAC administration will continue to research AAAM course and attempt to schedule for the Spring. Recommendation to order 100 of each size bike helmet and approvide proposed reimbursment for injury prevention and education for copliant members with a deadline for submitting paperwork as of 3/31/2024. Rac admin will prepare a survey to assess members different "needs" and will review those in January with the additional funding stream. Recommendation to continue to purchase and maintain propert stock of all the above items for use by RAC membership.
